Ferry Tales

Ferries — boats that travel an established route on a regular schedule — have linked the Vineyard to the mainland for over 300 years. Powered first by wind, then by steam, and now by diesel, they keep the Island supplied with the necessities of life. Eisenstaedt's Martha's Vineyard

One of the most respected photojournalists of the 20th century, Alfred Eisenstaedt (1898–1995) captured countless iconic images, from a sailor kissing a nurse in Times Square to portraits of kings, dictators, and movie stars. His decades-long career with *Life* magazine took him all over the world, but he found time to return to the Island each summer for more than 50 years. This exhibition shares the story of Eisenstaedt's Martha's Vineyard through his own words, along with photographs and objects in the Museum's collection.

Recovering and Re-centering
the Maritime Dimension
of the Underground Railroad

Uncover the maritime pathways to freedom with Dr. Timothy Walker in this captivating presentation about the little-known stories of freedom-seeking by sea and the less-understood maritime side of the Underground Railroad. Dr. Walker will discuss the importance of enslaved African Americans' labor in southern ports, focusing on African American agency, and how individuals managed escapes from the South to safe harbor in northern cities such as Philadelphia, New York, New Bedford, and Boston.
